1. Tye called the meeting order at 9:32 am by welcoming everyone and noting that no counsel was available.
2. Tye asked for approval of minutes from the previous meeting held July 20, 2021.
Boatwright moved to approve; Bowling seconded; all, yea.
3. A COA has been requested for 151 N. Third St. by Dr. Chas. Boyd, who wants to install solar panels on the west-facing slope of his dental office roof. The building is non-contributing, the part of the roof in question is not visible from the façade, and the panels could be removed, according to the staff report.
Bowling moved to approve the proposed change; Girard seconded the motion. All voted in favor of approval with no discussion.
4. House brought forward a letter from Karmell and Rick Mazurek that requests their Lanier/Tolliver House be protected by designation as a local historic landmark. House reported that while the house has vinyl siding, all else is original. The house meets criteria for this designation by adding to cultural understanding, as a prominent citizen, Edna Tolliver, was born and raised there, and it has value as a reminder of the cultural or archaeological heritage of the city.. In agreement with staff recommendation to approve the request:
Bowling so moved; Boatwright seconded; all voted "yea."
5. Girard moved to adjourn the meeting; Bowling seconded. Carried.
